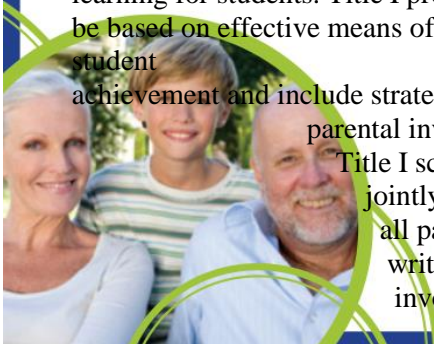

What is Title I?

Saint George Elementary is identified as a Title I school as part of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 (ESEA). Title I is designed to support State and local school reform efforts tied to challenging state academic standards and reinforcing and enhancing efforts to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support parental involvement. All Title I schools must jointly develop with all parents a written parental involvement plan.



School Plan for Shared Student Achievement

What is it?

This is a plan that describes how Saint George Elementary will provide opportunities to improve parent engagement to support student learning. Saint George Elementary values the contributions and involvement of parents to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. This plan describes the different ways that Saint George Elementary will support parent engagement and how parents can help plan and participate in activities and events to promote student learning at school and at home.



How is it revised?

Saint George Elementary School invited all parents to attend Muffin Monday in October to review and revise this parental involvement policy, as well as the schoolwide plan, our school-parent compact and the parental involvement budget. Additionally, parent input and comments regarding this plan are welcome during the school year through an online form. The plan is posted on our school Web site for parents to view and submit feedback throughout the year. All parent feedback received during the year will be used to revise the plan for the next school year. We also distribute an annual survey online and by sending it home to ask parents for their suggestions on the plan and the use of funds for parental involvement. Parents can also give feedback during several parent meetings and activities during the school year.

Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families, are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Saint George Elementary will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents with limited English, parents with disabilities and parents of migratory children.

Where is it available?

The plan is sent home with all students. The plan will also be posted on the school Web site. Parents can also retrieve a copy of the plan in the Parent Resource Center.

Lower Grades (K-3) – No Man Like a Snow Man! – January 19

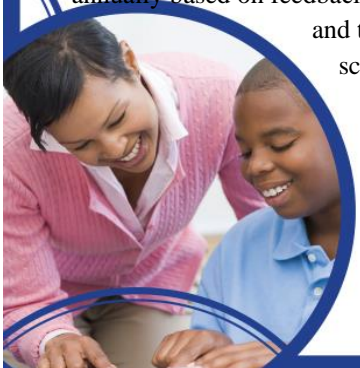
Complete a snowman craft project with your child. Then, come on the 19th to enjoy coffee and doughnuts as you tour the hallways and observe the students' creativity.
